- T = Transplanting period



Suggested harvesting period – The harvesting period may be influenced by a micro-climate on a specific farm.

Factors contributing to physiological disorders in onion

- Incorrect sowing time
- Incorrect sowing depth
- Excessive fertilisation
- Irregular irrigation
- Cold temperatures, especially below 7°C
- Growth stresses caused by heat, drought, water logging and disease
- Diurnal temperature flactuations this might induce bolting
